Go it Alone

When considering the costs of taking your own skis on holiday, it is important to ensure that you include all of the costs, both obvious, and those perhaps more hidden. It is all too easy to just look at the costs of paying airline ski carriage charges, and not take into account the costs of getting skis/boards serviced, buying a suitable bag/Sportube to take them in etc. Often, the need to take this extra luggage to and from the airport has a knock on effect in terms of the size car/taxi required too.

Add to that the additional hassle of carrying awkward luggage through the airport, waiting at the oversize luggage carousel, taking skis to and from a service outlet either here in the UK or in your resort, and of course the time element to do all of these.

Luggage cost

You may already have a bag or Sportube. (Increasingly airlines will only accept skis for transportation in a hard shell case because of the likelihood of damage when using a canvass bag) Current prices for Sportubes are £119.95 for a double/snowboard tube, or £79.95 for a single, and ensure that skis or boards are properly protected for their journey. Canvass or cardboard containers realistically, are not suitable)

Cost of luggage £ ____(A

Service costs

A proper service consists of base preparation, edge sharpening and wax treatment. Of course there may also be some additional repair work required. Typical costs for a basic service, this coming season, are £30 - £40 in the UK, or approx £35. In the states it is about \$45 to \$50.

Trip costs

Airline carriage charges vary enormously. The main ones are listed here:-

British Airways £28 per bag per flight (up to 23Kg) if

booked online, £35 at the airport. Extra charges apply for additional bags. These are for European flights. USA and Canada

are considerably higher.

Ryanair £40 per bag per flight booked online, £50

at the airport.

EasyJet £18.50 per bag per flight booked online,

£26 at the airport

Other airlines charge different fees, all are subject to availability and its worth checking with your airline.
